Philadelphia Handbell Ensemble to Perform on May 4th

The Philadelphia Handbell Ensemble will present a concert in our nave on Sunday, May 4, at 3:00 p.m. Invite your family and friends to attend what promises to be an enjoyable and varied program featuring original compositions, transcriptions of classical literature, and arrangements from a wide array of musical genres. Their spring program entitled "The Storm Shall Pass!" will showcase such works as Jason Krug's "Resounding Fury," Cathy Moklebust's "Thundersnow," and William Payn's "Prisms." The concert will also include the world premiere of a soon-to-be-published original handbell composition by the group's Associate Artistic Director, Bob Gardner.

Established in 2003, the Philadelphia Handbell Ensemble is comprised of auditioned, advanced-level handbell ringers from Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and Delaware. Under the leadership of Artistic Director Ron Bellamy, a well-known local handbell choir director and solo ringer, the ensemble currently plays on six and one-half octaves of Schulmerich bells. Handchimes and a large number of percussion instruments round out their artistic presentation. A free-will offering will be received during the intermission to help defray expenses and support our ongoing Music at Jerusalem series.

As we continue to celebrate Christ's resurrection throughout this 50-day season of Easter, a number of musical highlights have been planned for our worship during the month of May. Anthems to be sung by our Jerusalem Choir include "Praise the Lord" by George Frideric Handel (May 4), "The Lord's My Shepherd" by Marie Pooler (May 11), "I Give You a New Commandment" by Peter Aston (May 18), and "Peace I Leave with You" by Luigi Cherubini (May 25). On May 11, the anthem is based on Psalm 23, the assigned psalm for the Fourth Sunday of Easter (also known as "Good Shepherd Sunday"). The texts of the two anthems scheduled for May 18th and 25th are based on verses included in the Holy Gospel readings from the Gospel of John. The following organ voluntaries will be offered as preludes and postludes: "Trumpet Tune in D Major" by David N. Johnson and "Christ lag in Todesbanden" by Johann Sebastian Bach (May 4); "Sheep May Safely Graze" by Johann Sebastian Bach and "Grand Choeur" by Théodore Dubois (May 11); "Trumpet Voluntary" by John Bennett and "Festive Trumpet Tune" by David German (May 18); and "Fugue in C Major" ("Gigue") by Dietrich Buxtehude and "Fugue" from *Sonata No. 2* by Felix Mendelssohn (May 25).
