The Music & Worship Committee discussed the future of our Jerusalem Choir at its meeting on August 7th, given membership is in a state of transition. Because a weekly commitment on the part of some singers is not possible at this time, we will attempt to assemble a choir to sing on festival Sundays this fall (Reformation Sunday, All Saints Sunday, and Christ the King Sunday). Your understanding and support of this new venture will be greatly appreciated as we adapt to new ways of utilizing our current resources for the purpose of offering God our sung praise and prayer in this place.

Reports:

Secretary: The Secretary's Report from May 19, 2025 was distributed and discussed. Brad Clubb made a motion to accept the May 19, 2025 Secretary's Report; Patti Stripling seconded the motion; the motion was accepted.

Treasurer: The May 31, 2025 Treasurer's Report was distributed and discussed. Beth Smith, Treasurer reported a deficit of \$2,838.89. She cites decreased contributions as a factor. An announcement regarding this deficit will be placed in the bulletin. Patti Stripling made a motion to accept the May 31, 2025 Treasurer's Report subject to audit; Dave Carson seconded the motion; the motion was accepted.

Vicar: The Vicar's May report was distributed and discussed. Vicar Philip noted his 2026 Seminary dates

Committee Reports:

Sunday School: Adult Forum was finished at the end of May and will resume in September. Thank you to all who participated. Fellowship at 9:00am each Sunday will continue through the summer

Old Business:

1. Roof Repair: The quote from M&E Roofing to replace the Sunday School roof was approved at a special congregational meeting on June 8, 2025. M&E Roofing has placed JELC on its schedule. Work to be completed in 2-3 months due to roofer's backlog.

2. First Responder's Day: discussion took place on how to honor our first responders. A special service will take place on November 2, 2025; possibly a small token will be given. The other churches in Rothsville will be invited. JD Wissler to take this to Music and Worship.

New Business:

- 1. Zach Fetter obtained quotes for a new office computer, stating that the Microsoft 10 version currently on the computer will no longer be supported after October 2025. Hoffman Computer Associates provided a quote of \$925 plus installation of approx \$300; a similar unit from Best Buy would be \$1281.99 without installation. Brad Clubb made a motion to accept the quote from Hoffman Computer Associates to replace and install a new office computer at a cost of approximately \$1500; Patti Stripling seconded the motion; the motion was accepted.
- 2. Brenda Fetter from the Property Committee met with Leland Slate Roof Repair. Leland quoted \$1,797.46 to replace approx 8 slate tiles plus perform bell maintenance. The Carpenter fund would be used to pay for these repairs. Dave Carson made a motion to accept the proposal from Leland Slate Roof to replace slate roof tiles and to perform bell maintenance at a cost of \$1,797.46; Brad Clubb seconded the motion; the motion passed.
- 3. Vicar Philip Supeck brought a request from Camp Kirkenwald to replace five Coleman stoves that are used to cook meals with the campers. The cost is approximately \$150 each. The Youth Ministry fund could be used to fund the cost of the stoves. Jeanine Schreiber made a motion to fund the purchase of five Coleman stoves for Camp Kirkenwald at a cost of approximately \$750; Brad Clubb seconded the motion; the motion was accepted.

New Business:

- 1. Executive Council Restructure: with the passing of JD Wissler, a new council president must be elected. Discussion took place. Vicar Philip Supeck made a motion to nominate Patti Stripling for council president; Floss Morgan seconded the motion; the motion was accepted. With the election of Patti Stripling as council president, a new vice president will be elected at the August meeting.
- 2. Congregational Meeting: a congregational meeting needs to be held to discuss and vote on the changes to the constitution. This meeting date has been set for August 24, 2025 with electronic and paper copies of the constitution available for review.
- 3. Addendum to Letter of Agreement for Theological Education for Emerging Ministries Executed on June 20, 2024: this addendum is a yearly update to our agreement with Vicar Philip Supeck, updating salary and benefits. This addendum was reviewed and discussed. Brad Clubb made a motion to accept this addendum; Jeanine Schreiber seconded the motion; the motion was accepted.
- 4. Pip Ravegum Bequest: Pip Ravegum bequest \$2000 to Jerusalem Lutheran Church. Floss Morgan made a motion to use this bequest to fund the recent IT upgrades to the office computer system; Dave Carson seconded the motion: the motion was accepted.
- 5. Churchwide Assembly Expenses for Zach Fetter: Zach Fetter will be attending the Churchwide Assembly in Arizona from July 27- August 1, 2025 as the Male Young Adult Representative for the Lower Susquehanna Synod. The Synod covers the flights, but not food or hotel expenses. Vicar Philip Supeck made a motion to cover Churchwide Assembly expenses for Zach Fetter up to \$1000; Brad Clubb seconded the motion; the motion was accepted. The Youth Ministry and Seminary Education Fund will be used to finance these expenses.
- 6. Shared Ministry: Jean Slaymaker presented information from the Shared Ministry Committee concerning the Christmas Eve service. The committee proposes one Christmas Eve Service for 2025, to be held at BULC at 7:00 pm, with the location alternating each year. Discussion took place regarding who would lead the music and choir- this will be determined at a later date. Jeanine Schreiber made a motion to have a combined Christmas Eve Service on December 24, 2025 at Brickerville United Lutheran Church at 7:00 pm; Floss Morgan seconded the motion; the motion was accepted.

7. Carry On Jerusalem- A Vision of Hope for Our Future: Vicar Philip Supeck was contacted earlier this year by Pastor Rob Myallis from St Paul Lutheran Church, Lititz regarding an opportunity to build a small chapel at the St. Paul location where Jerusalem Evangelical Lutheran Church could continue to worship together without the burden of our current church building. The concept is for a Jerusalem Memorial Chapel. The Executive Committee met with Pastor Myallis in May to tour the St. Paul campus and to discuss this vision. There are many unanswered questions, but the full council decided to meet with Pastor Myallis at St. Paul's to further discuss this option to continue our ministry. This meeting will be scheduled for August or September.

Next Council Meeting: August 18, 2025

Adjournment: Brad Clubb made a motion to adjourn the meeting; Dave Carson seconded the motion; the motion was accepted.
