

From our Interim Pastor's Desk:

I have enjoyed communicating with you through the medium of the newsletter; thus it is with sadness that I compose my final article to you. As many of you know, my time with you will end on July 14 with July 9 being my last Sunday. Then, beginning July 15, I will be assuming the position of Interim Senior Pastor at Advent Lutheran Church in east York. While I am looking forward to this new opportunity, I certainly will miss you. What was originally intended to be just a two month call here ended up being expanded to six and a half months! I want to thank each congregation, too, for the greetings concerning my 40th anniversary of ordination and for the reception that was held in my honor following Jerusalem's service on June 18. Remember that this is our Lord's church and joyfully and eagerly work together with your sisters and brothers in Christ to faithfully engage in the Spirit led ministry to which you are blessed. As for me, I will remember you in my thoughts and prayers. I pray for God's blessings and guidance to always be with you. And it will be, for as our Lord assures us at the end of Matthew's gospel: "I am with you always, to the end of the age."



Greetings from the Quilt & Kit Ministry at Lutheran World Relief. I'm writing to update you about the Quilt & Kit Tracker.

The Quilt & Kit Tracker was launched in 2013 so that faithful people like you, who devote your time and talent so generously, could follow the journey of your quilts and kits to neighbors in need.

Now, more than a decade later, the technology behind the Tracker is obsolete, making the system unreliable and difficult to use. If you have used the Tracker in the last year or more, you have likely experienced lags in reporting or have been unable to retrieve updates. The Tracker is no longer serving its important purpose, and we are sorry for the frustration you experienced.

Therefore, as of May 15, the Quilt & Kit Tracker is officially out of service. This means that, moving forward, barcodes should no longer be used and that no reports or updates will be generated by the Tracker for previous donations with Tracker-generated barcodes.

Please rest assured that the quilts and kits you so lovingly assemble and ship to us are reaching neighbors around the world — as they always have. I've enclosed a list of all the countries quilts and kits reached in 2022.

Your hard work and generosity are as needed and appreciated as ever! In fact, one of the biggest shipments in Lutheran World Relief history will arrive this summer in Mali, where food prices have risen exorbitantly because of global supply chain bottlenecks and the war in Ukraine. Quilts and kits will reach communities where families are struggling to afford to eat, embracing them in God's love and helping them care for themselves and their families.

At the same time, plans are in motion for a completely new, state-of-the-art system that will allow you to follow quilts and kits from the time they leave your hands to the time they reach their destination. While we do not yet have a target completion date for this system, progress is underway and we will keep you updated as it takes shape. During this period of transition, we are committed to sharing more photos, videos and stories of your quilts and kits reaching your neighbors around the world.

Please share this update with your congregation, quilting group and others who have used the Tracker. And please do not hesitate to contact us if you have questions.

Thank you for your unwavering generosity and for being such a caring person. We are deeply grateful to God for your faithful partnership in this ministry.

Report of the 2023 LSS Synod Assembly

The Synod Assembly of the Lower Susquehanna Synod of the ELCA began with a ZOOM Edification Day on May 20th. Keynote speaker Pastor Jennifer Hope Tringali discussed her mission in Guatemala, Hope Academy. Hope Academy educates girls in Guatemala from age 7. The school currently enrolls over 100 girls, and is building a second floor to the current building which would accommodate 75 more students. The school is bilingual, and teaches the girls farming and business in addition to their regular schooling.

I attended a breakout session on church communication led by Deacon Marsha Roscoe. She stated that Jesus' Great Commission directs us to communicate our Christian message to others. How do we do that? She states that three ways our Church can get our message to others is through our website, Facebook and email. Deacon Roscoe emphasizes the importance of a good website, calling it our "new front door". A seminar on church communication will follow this summer or fall.

The business portion of the assembly took place via ZOOM on June 2nd and in person on June 3rd. The theme of this year's assembly was "Created for Community". Bishop Dunlap spoke about the importance of coming together as a church. He also identified four areas of focus for the LSS over the next two years:

Leadership Transitions
Celebrate Ministry of Small Congregations
Foster Regional Cooperation
Streamline Administration

The Report of the Churchwide Representative was delivered by Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton. She expressed appreciation for the generosity of the LSS to Mission Support, Lutheran Disaster Response and ELCA World Hunger.

Throughout the business meeting, several reports were given and nominations were made for open council and synod positions. Voting took place to fill these open positions. The 2024 Budget was presented and passed.

Discussion took place regarding the election of a new Bishop in 2025. Some of the rules for the election were changed. The Committee on Reference and Council proposed an amendement to add a youth from each congregation as a voting member to the assembly. A motion was made to amend the amendment to allow each congregation to send both a youth and a person of color as additional voting members to assembly. Discussion took place with the motion passing.

The assembly concluded with a Service of Holy Communion.

Pastor's Report: written report was read and discussed

Secretary's Report: written report was distributed and discussed. Motion to approve the report was made by Rene Amey; Andy Anderson seconded motion; the motion passed

Treasurer's Report: A written report was distributed and discussed. \$1300. Donation from the Lenten red envelope collection was made to LWR for earthquake relief in Turkey and Syria. 36 hats were made and sent to Seafarer's International. The Lenten loose plate offering totaled \$241. Discussion regarding where to send money took place- motion made by Jill Clubb to send money to LOVE, Inc.; seconded by Christine Anderson; the motion passed. A motion to accept the Treasurer's Report, subject to audit, was made by Jill Clubb; Christine Anderson seconded the motion; the motion passed

Old Business:

Prayer List administrator- Janice Styer volunteered Mulching has been completed

New Business:

Haller performed an annual preventative maintenance inspection of our HVAC systems. A heat pump refrigerant leakage was found in the heat pump servicing the upstairs educational classrooms. The cost to replace the heat pump would be \$12,333.00; the cost to repair the leakage would be \$3100.00 plus labor, but it would not be guaranteed that this repair would be successful. Another option would be to not replace the heat pump- fans would be used to cool the rooms, which are seldom used.

Heat would be provided by the original system. Discussion took place. A motion was made by Mike Fetter to put replacement or repair of the heat pump on hold until later this year or next year to see how we manage through the summer; motion was seconded by Zach Fetter; the motion passed.
