

# FROM THE DIRECTOR OF MUSIC

During the month of February, we will transition from the third to the fourth season of the church year. The assigned readings during the Sundays after the Epiphany focus on how God in the human form of Jesus Christ becomes known to an ever-widening audience. Like the hours of daylight gradually increasing with each passing day of the winter, the light of Christ burns brighter and shines farther as he is revealed to the magi, the fishermen who leave their nets to become disciples, and the multitudes who gather to hear the Sermon on the Mount. The Epiphany season culminates with a vision of the Son of God being transformed and transfigured in a blaze of brightness and glory. As we observe the Transfiguration of Our Lord on February 19, the Sending Hymn ("Alleluia, Song of Gladness" – *ELW* #318) will provide an opportunity to sing our last "Alleluias" before we begin our 40-day Lenten journey three days later on Ash Wednesday (February 22). Throughout Lent, the musical part of our Sunday liturgies will take on a more solemn tone to aid our spiritual self-examination and reflection: the word "Alleluia" is absent from all hymns and chants; the "Gloria in Excelsis" is omitted and in its place the "Kyrie" is sung; and the more contemplative plainsong setting of the service music (Setting Five) will once again be used.
